Our statewide goal in Nebraska is to purchase 30 nets per church for a total of **11,130** lives saved! How can your church help to eradicate this preventable disease? Here are some ideas to get you moving!

DINNER AND A MOVIE

Host a potluck dinner and show the film, "Killer in the Dark." Ask participants to consider how much money they would have spent on dinner and a movie out, and donate that amount to Imagine No Malaria.

HOST A SUMMER BBQ

Involve the community around you, and host a summer event at your church or in your community to raise funds for Imagine No Malaria. An event kit including promotional materials, planning resources, and great visuals is coming to your church. Stay on the lookout and start planning your event now!

A FOCUS IN WORSHIP

Have a 10-week focus on the campaign and incorporate worship resources found at <http://www.imagenomalaria.org/resources/church-resources/>. Encourage worship participants to bring a dollar a week for 10 weeks. Bring them up to the altar at the end of each worship service, praying for those whose lives are affected by this preventable disease. At the end of the 10 weeks, each worship participant will have donated a life-saving net!

Instead of asking for gifts for your birthday, ask your friends to save a life on your behalf! They can text "MALARIA" to 27722 to donate \$10!

MISSIONS FOCUS FOR VBS

Set up a bed net as a part of your Vacation Bible School props and use materials from the Imagine No Malaria campaign as your missions focus! Encourage creative fundraising with the children like pipe cleaner mosquitos, and lemonade stands. Set a goal for each child to provide the funds to save one life by the end of your VBS.
